Open to Chetnole Residents Only.

CLASS

1. A collection of 3 kinds of vegetables, 2 of each kind, displayed in an imaginative way - maximum space 15" x 15" (38cm x 38cm).
2. Four carrots.
3. Four runner beans.
4. A rainbow plate – a mix of at least 5 different coloured fruit and/or vegetables.
5. Three leeks.
6. Four tomatoes.
7. Four stalks of rhubarb, without leaves.
8. Two courgettes, max. 6" (15cm).
9. Two cucumbers.
10. Eight pods of French beans.
11. Four white potatoes.
12. The longest runner bean.
13. A dish of berries.

Open to All.

CLASS

14. A salad plate – a minimum of 3 different salad items.
15. Strangest shaped vegetable.
16. Four potatoes.
17. Five shallots.
18. Three beetroot (one variety).
19. A dish of fruit (one variety).
20. Five pods of peas.
21. A bulb of garlic.
22. A truss of cherry tomatoes.
23. A collection of mixed herbs.
24. Four onions from sets.

SECTION B. CHILDREN'S CLASSES Open to All.

Juniors 5 years and under:

SECTION C. FLOWERS

Open to All. No flower arranging to be done in the marquee.

CLASS

- 39. 12 stems of sweetpeas, in a vase.
- 40. Five dahlia blooms, in a vase.
- 41. Five rose blooms, in a vase.
- 42. A pot plant, foliage only, max pot size 8" (20cm) ht. 2'6" (75cm).
- 43. A flowering pot plant max pot size 8" (20cm) ht. 2'6" (75cm).
- 44. Three sprays of one variety of flowering shrub, in a vase.
- 45. A selection of annuals, in a vase.
- 46. A hanging basket (please bring hanging chain).
- 47. A selection of perennials, in a vase.
- 48. An orchid in a pot.
- 49. Three stems of phlox, in a vase.
- 50. One rose bloom.
- 51. A bowl of flowers of one colour.
- 52. One lily stem.

SECTION D. ARRANGED FLOWER CLASSES.

Open to All. No flower arranging to be done in the marquee.

N.B. Arrangements will be judged from all angles.

CLASS

- 53. An arrangement in a pint glass.
- 54. A miniature arrangement (space allowed W4" x D4" x H4") (10cm x 10cm x 10cm).
- 55. An arrangement of meadow flowers (space allowed W18" x D18" x H24") (46cm x 46cm x 61cm).
- 56. A hand tied bouquet.
- 57. Arrangement of five flowers of one colour (space allowed W12" x D12" x H24") (30cm x 30cm x 61cm).
- 58. An arrangement of grasses (space allowed W18" x D18" x H24") (46cm x 46cm x 61cm).

SECTION E. DOMESTIC.

Open to All.

**Exhibits in classes 66 – 74 must be on a plate and in a clear bag.
Please do not use CLING FILM.**

- 59. Jar of jelly - any variety.
- 60. Jar of jam - any variety.
- 61. Jar of marmalade.
- 62. Jar of fruit curd.
- 63. Jar of chutney (screw-top). To be dated.
- 64. Home-made drink – alcoholic e.g. sloe gin.
- 65. Home-made drink – non-alcoholic e.g. elderflower cordial.
- 66. A home-made quiche.
- 67. A Victoria sponge with jam filling.
- 68. A plate of homemade sweets.
- 69. Three cheese scones.
- 70. A decorated cake.
- 71. A boiled fruit cake.

Ingredients:

1lb. (400g) mixed dried fruit.

4ozs. (100g) margarine.

4ozs. (100g) brown sugar.

1 level tsp. bicarb of soda.

¼ pint water.

Method: Simmer above ingredients for 15 minutes, cool, then add 2 beaten eggs and 6ozs. self-raising flour. Mix well and bake in greased 7-8" (18-20cm) tin for 1-1½hrs. at 150°C, 300°F.

- 74. Souper duper muffins (makes 12 – but only 6 required)

Ingredients:

2 level tsp bicarb.

2 level tsp baking powder.

80g sugar.

225g plain flour.

75g cocoa powder.

100ml milk.

80g chopped dark chocolate.

200g chopped white chocolate.

3 eggs.

1 tsp vanilla extract.

400ml tomato soup.

Open to All. State size of Article and any Special Display Requirements.

- 75. A knitted or crocheted Item.
- 76. A sculpture made from natural materials.
- 77. A potato print pillow case.
- 78. An item of jewellery.
- 79. Tapestry or cross stitch.
- 80. Handmade card, max size A4.
- 81. A felted item.
- 82. A scarecrow.

SECTION G. AMATEUR PAINTING & PHOTOGRAPHY

Open to All.

Paintings and Photographs to be delivered to the Village Hall on Friday 31st July between 10am and 12 noon, or handed to the secretary before then e.g. with entry form.

Paintings in classes 83 to 86 to be mounted or framed to hang, INCLUDING SCREW EYES ON BACK, not more than 24" (61cm) including mount in either direction. No clip frames please.

CLASS

- 83. Painting, oils, acrylics or mixed media.
- 84. Watercolour or pen & wash.
- 85. Pastel or drawing.
- 86. Picture in any medium, for secondary school age.

Photographs may be film or digital, and may be colour, B&W or sepia, maximum size 10" (25cm) in either direction.

CLASS

- 87. A black and white photo.
- 88. Photo – a stunning view.
- 89. Photo – close up.
- 90. Photo – ‘Creature Comforts’.
- 91. Special Interest Photo – ‘In Disguise’.
- 92. For age 16 and under – ‘A Chetnole Landmark’.

RULES

1. **No exhibitor may enter more than 3 exhibits in any Class, but only one prize will be awarded to one exhibitor.**
2. Any prize may be modified if the exhibits are not considered to be of sufficient merit, or if less than 3 entries in a class.
3. All exhibits in Sections A and C must have been grown by the exhibitor (occasional part-time professional assistance is acceptable). Anyone exhibiting anything in these Sections not of their own growing, the whole of that person's exhibits may be disqualified and must not be entered under any other name.
4. Entries for Sections F and G must be exhibitors' own work and not previously shown at this Show. Class cards must be attached to all items in these Sections.
5. The Children's Shield will be awarded to the Chetnole resident with the most points in Section B.
6. **All entry forms must be filled in correctly and to reach the Show Secretary, Pippa Fowler, Tanglewood, Chetnole DT9 6NY by 8.00pm on Thursday 5th August 2021.**
7. Exhibits, except Section G, may be staged from 8.00am to 9.30am on the day of the Show. All staging must be finished and exhibitors out of the tent or hall by 9.30am sharp. **Section G. Paintings and Photographs must be brought to the Village Hall for hanging between 9.30am and 12 noon on Friday 6th August 2021 or handed to the secretary before then.**
8. Exhibitors must bring their own plates, vases, or cloths for their exhibits. **All food in Section E must be presented in clear bags and on plates.** All preserves must be in clear glass jars with appropriate covers.
9. Prize money will be attached to prize winners cards. Exhibits must not be removed before 5pm.
10. Any complaint or objection must be lodged with the Secretary by 4pm on the day of the Show, accompanied by 50p for each complaint in writing – if upheld, this will be returned, otherwise it will be forfeited.
11. **Winners' cups must be returned to the Secretary by 30th June (01935 873544).**
12. The decision of the judges shall be final, and the decision of the Committee in all other matters connected with the Show shall be final.
13. Stewards reserve the right to move exhibits if necessary.
- N.B. The Judges are guided by RHS show handbook; a copy is held by the Secretary and may be consulted on request.
