SECTION D. ARRANGED FLOWER CLASSES.

Open to All. No flower arranging to be done in the marquee. Flowers may be purchased. N.B. Arrangements will be judged from all angles.

CLASS

55. An arrangement in a pint glass.
56. An arrangement of miniature flowers (space allowed W4" x D4" x H4") (10cm x 10cm x 10cm).
57. A table centrepiece with candles (space allowed W12" x D12" x H24") (30cm x 30cm x 60cm).
58. A 'crown' arrangement (space allowed W12" x D12" x H15") (30cm x 30cm x 40cm).
59. Floating flowerheads displayed in a shallow container not exceeding 30cm.
60. A flowerless beauty – an arrangement of foliage/grasses/twigs (space allowed W18" x D18" x H24") (46cm x 46cm x 60cm).

73. CHALLENGE: Dorset Apple Cake

Ingredients:

155g unsalted butter, diced and chilled, plus extra for the tin	1 egg, beaten
225g self raising flour	6 – 8 tbsp milk
2 tsp ground cinnamon	225g apples, peeled, cored and diced
115g light brown sugar	100g sultanas
	2 tbsp demerara sugar

Method:

Heat the oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Butter and line a deep 20cm cake tin with baking parchment.

Mix the flour and cinnamon together in a large bowl. Add the butter and rub into the flour using your fingers, until it resembles fine breadcrumbs. Stir in

the light brown sugar. Beat in the egg followed by 6-8 tbsp of milk – add it gradually until you have a smooth, thick batter.

Add the apples and sultanas and mix to combine. Scrape the batter into the prepared tin and gently level out. Sprinkle over the demerara sugar, and bake for 30-40 mins or until golden and a skewer inserted into the middle comes out clean.

Allow to cool in the tin for 15 mins and then carefully turn out onto a wire rack to cool further.

76. Red velvet cake

Ingredients:

<i>175g self raising flour</i>	<i>150g caster sugar</i>	<i>150ml buttermilk</i>
<i>3 tbsp cocoa powder</i>	<i>2 eggs</i>	<i>2 tbsp red food colouring</i>
<i>1 tsp bicarbonate of soda</i>	<i>150ml sunflower oil</i>	

For the frosting:

<i>100g butter, softened</i>	<i>250g icing sugar</i>	<i>300g soft cheese</i>
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Method:

Heat the oven to 180C/fan 160C/gas 4 and line two 18cm sandwich tins with baking paper. Stir the dry ingredients together in a large bowl. Beat the eggs and add to the oil and buttermilk, then stir in the food colouring. Stir the wet ingredients into the dry and then beat them together with an electric whisk until a smooth batter forms.

Divide the mixture between the tins and bake for 25-30 minutes or until risen and a skewer poked into the centres of the cakes comes out clean. Cool on a wire rack.

To make the frosting, beat the butter and icing sugar together until smooth, then beat in the soft cheese. Put a layer of frosting between the cake layers and then use the rest to frost the cake.

Paintings in classes 85 – 88 to be mounted or framed to hang, INCLUDING SCREW EYES ON BACK, not more than 24” (61cm) including mount in either direction. No clip frames please.

- 85. Painting, oils, acrylics or mixed media.
- 86. Watercolour or pen & wash.
- 87. Pastel or drawing.
- 88. Picture in any medium, for secondary school age.

Photographs may be film or digital, and may be colour, B&W or sepia, maximum size 10” (25cm) in either direction.

- 89. A black and white photo.
- 90. Photo – weather.
- 91. Photo – a sporting moment.
- 92. Photo – ‘Fur and feathers’.
- 93. Special interest Photo – ‘Eye(s)’.
- 94. For age 16 and under – ‘A funny face’.
- 95. For age 12 and under – a flower.

SECTION H. CHETNOLE COMMUNITY CHALLENGE.

Open to Chetnole residents and to be judged by the Flower Show Committee.

CLASS

- 96. Artwork to adorn Chetnole Halt. An image representing “A Day in the Life of Chetnole”, to greet passengers at Chetnole Halt. No larger than 600mm long x 400mm wide. Selected entries will be enlarged and mounted where necessary. Any medium: photography, paint, crayon, embroidery.
- 97. Sunflowers for Ukraine.
Show your continued support for Ukraine by growing the tallest sunflower (their national flower) in your garden. To be judged in situ on Friday 4th August. (Please state height of sunflower on entry form.)

RULES

1. **No exhibitor may enter more than 3 exhibits in any Class, but only one prize will be awarded to one exhibitor.**
 2. Any prize may be modified if the exhibits are not considered to be of sufficient merit, or if less than 3 entries in a class.
 3. All exhibits in Sections A and C must have been grown by the exhibitor (occasional part-time professional assistance is acceptable). Anyone exhibiting anything in these Sections not of their own growing, the whole of that person's exhibits may be disqualified and must not be entered under any other name.
 4. Entries for Sections F and G must be exhibitors' own work and not previously shown at this Show. Class cards must be attached to all items in these Sections.
 5. The Children's Shield will be awarded to the Chetnole resident with the most points in Section B.
 6. **All entry forms must be filled in correctly and to reach the Show Secretary, Pippa Fowler, Tanglewood, Chetnole DT9 6NY by 8.00pm on Thursday 3rd August 2023.**
 7. Exhibits, except Section G, may be staged from 8.00am to 9.30am on the day of the Show. All staging must be finished and exhibitors out of the tent or hall by 9.30am sharp. **Section G. Paintings and Photographs must be brought to the Village Hall for hanging between 9.30am and 12 noon on Friday 4th August 2023 or handed to the secretary before then.**
 8. Exhibitors must bring their own plates, vases, or cloths for their exhibits. **All food in Section E must be presented in clear bags and on plates.** All preserves must be in clear glass jars with appropriate covers.
 9. Prize money will be attached to prize winners cards. Exhibits must not be removed before 5pm.
 10. Any complaint or objection must be lodged with the Secretary by 4pm on the day of the Show, accompanied by 50p for each complaint in writing – if upheld, this will be returned, otherwise it will be forfeited.
 11. **Winners' cups must be returned to the Secretary by 30th June (01935 873544).**
 12. The decision of the judges shall be final, and the decision of the Committee in all other matters connected with the Show shall be final.
 13. Stewards reserve the right to move exhibits if necessary.
