Open to All. No flower arranging to be done in the marquee. Flowers may be purchased. N.B. Arrangements will be judged from all angles.

CLASS

55. An arrangement in a pint glass.
56. An arrangement of miniature flowers (space allowed W4" x D4" x H4") (10cm x 10cm x 10cm).
57. A table centrepiece (space allowed W12" x D12" x H15") (30cm x 30cm x 60cm).
58. An Olympic torch arrangement (space allowed W12" x D12" x H15").
59. Floating flowerheads displayed in a shallow container not exceeding 30cm.
60. A flowerless beauty – an arrangement of foliage/grasses/twigs (space allowed W18" x D18" x H24") (46cm x 46cm x 60cm).

78. CHALLENGE: Coffee and walnut cake.

Ingredients:

100g unsalted butter, softened, plus extra for greasing

100g caster sugar

2 eggs

100g self-raising flour

½ teaspoon baking powder

1 tbsp coffee granules, dissolved in 1 tablespoon of boiling water

50 g chopped walnuts

For the filling and topping:

125g unsalted butter, softened

225g icing sugar

1 tbsp coffee granules, dissolved in 1 tablespoon of boiling water

8 walnut halves, to decorate

Method:

Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan/Gas 4. Lightly butter two loose-bottomed 18cm/7in sandwich tins and line the bases with baking paper.

Put the butter, sugar, eggs, flour, baking powder and coffee in a large mixing bowl and beat together until well combined and smooth. Fold in the walnuts.

Divide the mixture evenly between the tins. Level the surface using a spatula or the back of a spoon.

Bake for 15-20 minutes.

For the filling and topping, beat the butter and gradually add the icing sugar. Add the coffee and beat until smooth.

Put one cake top-down onto a serving plate and spread with half the coffee icing. Sandwich together with the other half. Ice the top of the cake and decorate with the walnut pieces to serve.

Open to All.

Paintings and Photographs to be delivered to the Village Hall on Friday 2nd August between 9.30am and 12 noon, or handed to the secretary before then e.g. with entry form.

Paintings in classes 88 – 91 to be mounted or framed to hang, INCLUDING SCREW EYES ON BACK, not more than 24” (61cm) including mount in either direction. No clip frames please.

- 88. Painting, oils, acrylics or mixed media.
- 89. Watercolour or pen & wash.
- 90. Pastel or drawing.
- 91. Picture in any medium, for secondary school age.

Photographs may be film or digital, and may be colour, B&W or sepia, maximum size 10” (25cm) in either direction.

CLASS

- 92. A black and white photo.
- 93. Photo – night vision.
- 94. Photo – A Chetnole landmark.
- 95. Photo – ‘Village Life’.
- 96. Photo – ‘Happiness’.
- 97. Photo – A sporting moment.
- 98. For age 16 and under – ‘Friendship’.

SECTION H. CHETNOLE COMMUNITY CHALLENGE.

Open to Chetnole residents and to be judged by the Flower Show Committee.

CLASS

- 100. ‘Bridges of Chetnole’ Challenge – a paper and card construction (glue and tape can be used but no reinforcing with other materials). To be judged on design and aesthetics as well as weight held.

RULES

1. **No exhibitor may enter more than 3 exhibits in any Class, but only one prize will be awarded to one exhibitor.**
 2. Any prize may be modified if the exhibits are not considered to be of sufficient merit, or if less than 3 entries in a class.
 3. All exhibits in Sections A and C must have been grown by the exhibitor (occasional part-time professional assistance is acceptable). Anyone exhibiting anything in these Sections not of their own growing, the whole of that person's exhibits may be disqualified and must not be entered under any other name.
 4. Entries for Sections F and G must be exhibitors' own work and not previously shown at this Show. Class cards must be attached to all items in these Sections.
 5. The Children's Shield will be awarded to the Chetnole resident with the most points in Section B.
 6. **All entry forms must be filled in correctly and to reach the Show Secretary, Pippa Fowler, Tanglewood, Chetnole DT9 6NY by 8.00pm on Thursday 1st August 2024.**
 7. Exhibits, except Section G, may be staged from 8.00am to 9.30am on the day of the Show. All staging must be finished and exhibitors out of the tent or hall by 9.30am sharp. **Section G. Paintings and Photographs must be brought to the Village Hall for hanging between 9.30am and 12 noon on Friday 2nd August 2024 or handed to the secretary before then.**
 8. Exhibitors must bring their own plates, vases, or cloths for their exhibits. **All food in Section E must be presented in clear bags and on plates.** All preserves must be in clear glass jars with appropriate covers.
 9. Prize money will be paid out after 4.45pm on surrender of the WHITE CLASS CARDS. Exhibits must not be removed before 5.00pm.
 10. Any complaint or objection must be lodged with the Secretary by 4pm on the day of the Show, accompanied by 50p for each complaint in writing – if upheld, this will be returned, otherwise it will be forfeited.
 11. **Winners' cups must be returned to the Secretary by 30th June (01935 873544).**
 12. The decision of the judges shall be final, and the decision of the Committee in all other matters connected with the Show shall be final.
 13. Stewards reserve the right to move exhibits if necessary.
